#### Message from Our Minister Rev. Pam Philips

## **Tidings of Comfort and Joy**

As we enter the winter months, we encounter all kinds of messages to be joyful. Think of all the different religious holidays celebrated with light as we move into a time of darkness—candles and twinkling lights abound. And yet, we are faced with news every day reminding us that we are still mired in a pandemic, the most recent being the Omicron variant. How are we to reconcile these conflicting messages of joy and sorrow? That's a question also raised by our theme this month—*Opening to*Jov.



Our culture's insistence on celebration—all those bright and gaudy Christmas decorations that have been up since Halloween, the loud and persistent strains of carols on radios and in public spaces, the overly sentimental and cheesy holiday movies, and advertisements for Black Friday and other sales to buy, buy, buy—can be overwhelming. It is all too much. Some of us may react to the invitation to Open to Joy with imitations of Ebenezer Scrooge or the Grinch. Bah Humbug!

But what if we reframe the invitation? Instead of thinking of it as flinging wide a window or door to all the noise and confusion of the holiday season, we think of it instead as a softening of the heart to more quiet moments of joy. As I think of some of the beloved members of our congregation we have lost this past year, I remember what brought them joy—a purring cat, a smiling grandchild, a dog bounding into the room, a memory, a song.

December offers us opportunities for both kinds of joy – the big, splashy ones and the small, quiet ones. At UUC, the usual chances to connect continue—the Monday morning breakfast groups, meditation, conversations on faith, yoga, choir, and several support groups. We also have a special opportunity to serve—supporting Glade Church as they host overnight guests of *To Our House*. In worship, we'll also have moments of quiet reflection and joyful exuberance. Our annual "no-rehearsal play" on the 19<sup>th</sup> will showcase the talent of UUC actors as Scrooge opens to the joy of the season in *A Christmas Carol*, written by Unitarian Charles Dickens. On Christmas Eve, we'll gather at the upper firepit to sing Christmas carols (weather permitting) and then in the sanctuary and on Zoom for a more traditional service, ending with candlelight. On New Year's Eve and Day, the labyrinth will be decorated with lights for evening walks, and the lower firepit will be lit for those who want to gather for cookies and cocoa. We need help to make these activities possible—from fire stokers to cookie bakers. Please, volunteer if it will bring you joy. (See articles in the newsletter about all these activities and events and how you can volunteer, if requested.)

Yes, we have lost loved ones in the past year and face an uncertain future. All the more reason to open to joys, large and small, to comfort us as we face *all* that is our lives. This month, let us take time to appreciate moments of joy. Let us take time to create moments of joy. For ourselves, for each other, for a world in need of our courageous love.

#### Message from Our Board

Gene Gardner, Member-at-Large

In the past I've attended a few Board meetings – usually to explain an initiative by a committee I was on or to support a proposal made by someone else. But until becoming a Board member, I did not have visibility of the big picture.



Our congregation has a lot of moving parts that need attention at some point or another. On one level, the Board reviews financial allocations, approves facilities requests and purchase agreements, and revises policies.

But it also facilitates committees enacting ideas proposed in the Strategic Plan, supports existing and new programs and sponsored groups, oversees personnel-related transitions, renews certifications, and develops new procedures for rapidly-changing issues like pandemic safety measures.

Many of these activities are similar to other decision-making groups I have served on, but there is one significant difference - and it has to do with our UU mission and principles.

The ancient Greeks had four words for different types of love. Three were about affection (storge), friendship (philia), and romance (eros). But the fourth (agape) was the most admirable – love as an action. It requires faithfulness, commitment, and sacrifice without expecting anything in return.

So many of the items that come before the Board (even seemingly mundane ones) ultimately support the underlying purpose and direction of our community.

One of the promises we made in our 2021-22 Board Covenant is – "We will keep the best interests of our diverse congregation at heart, carrying out the trust placed in us as guardians of the UUC Mission and UUA Principles."

It is an honor to be a part of that effort.

# **Solar Panel Installation Begins!**

On November 22, Patrick Feucht and his able crew from Baseline Solar began installing the racking on our roof for the solar panels. Then comes the placement of 80 solar panels which takes about a week. The wiring and installation of the invertor panel and meter come next. The final step is obtaining AEP's stamp of approval.









Let the solar power begin and applause to UUC for "walking the talk" for sustainable energy at UUC!

for future generations, draw a picture, sign your name, or leave a smiley face! Use one of the Sharpies provided to sign the back side (white side) of the panel but **be careful!** You won't get hurt, but solar panels are somewhat fragile, so write gently and try not to lean on, hit, or scratch the panels! The panels can be found behind UUC near the Crescent Garden leaning against the building until **December 1** when they will likely be installed on the roof. If you would like to sign a panel but can't get there by December 1 to do so, email <u>Patrick</u>, and he can leave them out a



bit longer including before and after the service on **December 5**.

Preferably, it should come in a disposable container. You will need to deliver your dish to Glade Church sometime from 5:15 – 5:45 pm or arrange beforehand for it to be picked up from you. # **Round the Grounds**by Susan Baker, co-chair

Gosh! Golly! Jeepers Creepers! 2021 has been a good year for UUC's grounds. Use of the grounds by congregants and neighbors has increased exponentially. Several additional trees and bee-attracting shrubs were added to our growing inventory of "carbon-eating flora". There is now a second set of steps leading to the upper part of the grounds. Erosion-control rock work along our driveway was completed, and rocks have been placed around some trees to prevent movement of mulch. The COVID troll was installed and now holds court in the fern garden along the Meditation Path. The two problematic detention ponds have been cleaned out and made functional (no more over-flow flooding!). Thanks to heavy-duty

work on the back entrance (off Lark Lane), it's now very easy to enter the outer -most areas of our grounds. About 30 cubic yards of mulch and a huge pile of

woodchips were spread for weed control.

Ongoing maintenance of the grounds requires a cast of dedicated volunteers:

Denise Martin – vine puller, trimmer, garden artist, and cheerful assistant

George Lally - resident counselor and man of many talents and thoughts

"Water maids" - Alyssa Short and Linda Pfeiffer who did weekly watering of potted plants

Joe Powers - single-handedly reworked the detention ponds, maintains the mowers, composts the fall leaves, serves as truck driver

Amanda Haynes – path keeper (unfortunately has to sign off due to work schedule)

Greg Evanylo – mowing and compost manager, sustainability advisor

On-call workers - Walter Pirie, Tom Bube, Bob Stimson, and Dick Luke

We had successful spring and fall workdays with over 20 volunteers for each. These wonderful people worked hard!



I'm ending the 2021 year with appreciation for the encouragement congregants have given grounds workers, suggestions given, and the blessings of being part of



# Children's RE

Our fun continues this month as we meet in person on Sunday mornings!

Classes will be meeting outdoors, weather permitting; and indoors with mitigation. Masking and distancing are required. Parents should stop at the sign-in table (located by the playground or in the downstairs lobby) between 9:45-10:00 AM to sign in children for class.

**PreK:** Our preschool friends will enjoy a story and playtime together. Coloring sheets, activity pages, and simple crafts will also be available for creative times.



**Grades K-5:** Our elementary children will be grouped into two classes: K-2 and grades 3-5. Both groups will work on the same theme, with age-appropriate activities.

**December 5:** Dan Thorp, Assoc. Professor of History at VT. "History, Myth, and the Founding of the United States": From Pilgrims stepping ashore on Plymouth Rock to George Washington confessing to the destruction of his father's cherry tree, history and myth have existed together in the story of the U.S. Many of the myths have had little real impact on how Americans view themselves. ## **December's Theme: Opening to Joy**
