#### Message from Our Minister Rev. Pam Philips

**Rooted, Inspired, and Ready**—that was the theme of our annual General Assembly (GA) of Unitarian Universalists. I'm writing this on the last day of GA, which I "attended" from my living room and porch.

Attending GA online wasn't the same as being physically together with thousands of UUs. I missed seeing old friends and colleagues, running into them in line for coffee or racing to workshops. We had to be more intentional about being together by setting up Zoom meetings and messaging each other during the general sessions to chat about the proceedings. I missed singing favorite UU hymns, enveloped by the sound of so many voices around me. I *knew* others were watching from their living rooms and porches, but . . .

And . . . this morning, for the first time ever, I was able to share, really share, a GA Sunday worship with the people I love, with all of you. We all listened to beautiful music and inspiring words, together. (If you didn't attend, you can watch it at this <u>link</u>.)

Like so much of life since the pandemic started, attending GA was a case of sadness for what we've lost and gratitude for new opportunities. And a reminder that we have to be intentional if we want to maintain our connections.

In the end, I did get a sense of being **rooted** in my Unitarian Universalist faith. In meetings, workshops, and worship services, I was reminded of our tradition and of those who paved the way to the present. I was **inspired** by all the energy and enthusiasm and ideas of how we might more fully live into our aspirations as Unitarian Universalists. The report of the *Commission on Institutional Change--Widening* the Circle of Concern-- and the subsequent discussions of how we might follow their recommendations gave me hope that our denomination, that our congregation, can play a role in what feels like a great shift in this country toward greater justice and equity. But am I **ready** to move forward and act? One answer I'm taking from GA is that we may not feel *fully* prepared, but we can move into the future anyway.

Part of my effort to prepare for the year ahead—to get ready—is to take the month of July for vacation and study leave. As for many of you, the demands of stay-at-home have been all-consuming and exhausting. I need time for rest, restoration, and reflection. I'm guessing we all do. In the month ahead, I encourage us all to make time for relaxation, for activities that help restore our energy, and for considering how the lessons from these past few months can help us live into our uncertain future.

I'm grateful for everyone at UUC whose hard work and commitment will make it easier for me to take this needed time away: the Worship Team who will be leading Sunday services that promise to be inspiring; the Lay Pastoral Care Ministry, and particularly Jane Mahone and Jennifer Mercier, who will be answering calls for pastoral support; our administrator, Lisa Evanylo, who will be the contact for setting up Zoom meetings and other day-to-day issues; our Lifespan Faith Development Director, Karen Hager, who will be returning from her sabbatical on **July 5**, and the Executive Board led by incoming president, Wayne Neu, who will handle congregational issues.

I am very grateful for this community of love and care, and I will be glad to be "back" in August.

## Message from Our Board

Wayne Neu, Board President

As I begin my year as President, the world is dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and the political pressures it has brought, a refocusing on racial justice issues, and a myriad of financial issues brought about by the shutdown of many businesses. All of these have directly affected our congregation along with the rest of our nation and world. My year as president is starting out looking like a very challenging one.



By the time you read this, the state of Virginia will have entered Phase III of reopening. As of July 1, UUC's building will have been closed for 16 weeks. I, and the rest of the Executive Board, are keenly aware of the desire of many of our congregants to find comfort and seek answers through person-to-person interaction, including Sunday services, in our building. We are also keenly aware of the real fears and dangers that are involved in close contact with others, particularly for our many older congregants. When and how to reopen our building safely will certainly be one of the most important issues we will face over the coming months. At our June meeting, the Board tasked the Safety Committee with pouring through the many guidance documents we have accumulated to formulate a set of procedures tailored to our situation that we might use during that reopening, when it comes. The Board has been fortunate to be able to consult with our member, Linsey Marr, whose research at Virginia Tech includes how viruses spread. We are so grateful to have someone we can speak with who has first-hand knowledge of the latest research on this subject. Do trust that any reopening of the building will be done in phases, beginning with small groups and begun only when we judge that local conditions will allow it. When that does happen, you can expect to see many precautions, perhaps including hand sanitizer stations, one-way traffic flow, and plenty of extra cleaning. When the time comes to begin services in the building, we do not plan to stop the virtual Zoom services. We'll just be broadcasting those from the pulpit. That will require that some additional, as-yet undefined, equipment be installed in the sanctuary. Those expenses may well be offset by the savings we have realized by having the building closed. The Board certainly has many important decisions to make this year!

And speaking of virtual services, I've been impressed with the way Rev. Pam has held us together via Zoom. I can't say that it's almost like being in the sanctuary, but it has been a wonderful way to stay connected to all the feelings and thoughts that came with attending an in-person service. Learning the technology has been a challenge in many ways but Rev. Pam, with Jamie McReynolds doing facilitation work in the background, continues to gain a level of mastery that is impressive. Jared and Natalie Gibbs have teamed up to lead us in hymns, and I particularly appreciate the chance to sing along. Of course, we still have Jared's music for a prelude and postlude. I hope you all have had the chance to join us virtually on Sunday mornings. For an attendee, Zoom is very easy to use, and I always come away being glad I was there.

In other goings on, our Strategic Planning Committee has been working to map out how we will work in the future to advance our mission and vision. They have prepared a survey that I encourage each of us to take (see page 8 for more info and the link). This will help determine what we, as a congregation, feel is important and ways we can work toward progress in those areas. On the Finance Committee, Chris Eagan has stepped down as chair, and Joe Powers has graciously agreed to take his place. I want to thank Chris for his service in that capacity and Joe for agreeing to carry that committee forward.

## Update on Building Closure & Use of Outdoor Space

The Board has authorized the closing of our building until further notice, although the situation is reevaluated month by month. If you have a group of 10 or fewer and would like to gather in either of our picnic areas or else-where on our grounds, let <u>Lisa</u> know the date and time. Note that the building and bathrooms remain locked and will **NOT** be accessible.

## Update on UUC's Fundraiser 2020 (formerly known as the Auction)

Bid and buy through the website or app. It's easy to donate items by contacting the Auction Committee with the details of your offer along with a picture of the item. Items in the auction may vary from month to month, with some items having a limited offer time. Check the site often.

## **Ideas:** Could you host a social distance party this summer? Offer food delivery? Provide a needed service for someone or need a chore done yourself? Be creative!

The website allows bidders to register a credit card and easily check your balance and items you have won. It lets you know if you have been outbid and allows you to set a proxy amount for rebidding.
