Message from Our Minister Rev. Pam Philips

Once again, I write my July letter to you fresh from time engaged with our larger UU movement, attending Ministry Days and the UUA General Assembly. Once again, we gathered on-line instead of in-person, but this year, delegates Stephen Henninger, Jamie McReynolds, Ellen Plummer, and Bob Stimson gathered in Elarth Hall to represent UUC in the general meetings, voting to elect members of the UUA Board of Trustees, make changes to by-laws, and adopt a <u>Statement of Conscience</u> and <u>Actions of Immediate Witness</u>. And many of you helped Karen Hager and me celebrate the <u>Service of the Living Tradition</u> in the Crescent Garden. Once again, our congregation connected with UUs across the continent by attending <u>GA Sunday</u> worship together, inspired by the words and music offered by the First Universalist



Church of Minneapolis. It is good to be reminded that we are part of a much larger movement. I will be spending some of my study leave in July viewing many of the recorded workshops I didn't have time to attend and will bring some of that learning back with me in the fall. Likewise, our delegates will share their learnings in a worship service in September.

Looking back on the past church year, I am grateful and amazed at all we have accomplished, in spite and because of the pandemic. The Worship Team continued to learn how to make our Sunday services and mid-week gatherings engaging and compelling. What we have learned about Zoom and other technologies will help us as we move to multi-platform services—allowing in-person and on-line participation, starting (if all goes well) in late August. The Safety and Technology Committees are helping pave the way toward this end.

The Connections Committee, Lay Pastoral Care Ministry, Caring Network, Soul Matters and other small groups have continued to hold us together in compassionate community. The Lifespan Faith Development program, including children, youth, and adult classes, groups, and workshops continued to inspire spiritual and ethical growth. The Grounds Ministry has maintained and improved places for gathering and for spiritual sustenance.

The Executive Board continued its usual work while making difficult decisions about the building closure. The entire congregation contributed to a successful stewardship pledge campaign, committing to the present and the future of UUC. The <u>Strategic Planning Committee report</u>, written after surveying and listening to the congregation, will help us live into our mission and vision more fully. The committee will formally introduce and answer questions about their report at the beginning of the next church year. The Leadership Development Committee created a slate of wonderful new Board members and is working on an exciting program you will also hear about soon.

The Anti-Racism Group introduced and educated the congregation about the 8th principle which was adopted at our annual meeting after a vigorous debate. I am proud that we did not "rubber stamp" our adoption, instead expressing and hearing different perspectives. I am excited to see how we will "work to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

Thanks to all who have made this past year one of moving forward, not standing still, during difficult times. Thanks to all who have continued to show up for each other and this spiritual community. Thanks to you all, our future is bright.

UUC Community News

June Board Mtg. Highlights

- Guidelines for indoor and outdoor use of the building were updated — see page 8 for details.
- The results of the recent congregational survey with questions about returning to in-person services were discussed. 84% of us are vaccinated with 90% expected to be so within the next 3 months. Results available shortly.
- It is hoped that hybrid services (both via Zoom and in person) will start in late August.
- Budget for 2021-22 was finalized.
- Rev. Jamie McReynolds was approved as our 4th delegate to General Assembly.
- A gift of \$800 to pay for an energy check of the building was accepted as were 2 gifts totaling \$1050 for our grounds.
- The Board approved UUC's co-sponsorship of forums being held in the Roanoke and New River Valleys by an interfaith racial justice group.

The next Board meeting will be held on Thursday, **July 8** at 7 PM. The <u>minutes and reports</u> of meetings for the past two calendar years are available.

Round the Grounds by Susan Baker, chair

The usage of UUC's grounds is happily in full swing - from a wedding to meetings, Yoga, play days, and quiet walking. I'm delighted to announce my new co-chair, Denise Martin. Denise has been

an indispensable help in keeping the grounds in top shape for use by congregants, friends, and neighbors. She is not only a quick learner and an idea person, but she's also a valued friend.

Another new addition to the Grounds Ministry is Greg Evanylo. Greg has been providing sound advice to the Grounds Ministry for several years, does some of the mowing, and is moving UUC toward an improved system of composting on our grounds.

Kudos to Denise and Greg!

The Grounds Ministry takes seriously the mandate to welcome all. This welcomed baby fawn was found outside Rev Pam's office waiting for its appointment with Pam. The fawn's mother eventually arrived to move her baby to a more fitting environment.

Tah-dah! George Lally has completed his "12-step program" with the completion of 12 stabilizing steps leading from the far end of the parking lot to the upper lawn. Handrails were added - one for adults and one for children (lower height of the rail). George got construction assistance from man-of-many-talents, **Dick Luke**.

Along the Crescent Garden side of the building is a nature table built by **David Warner**. Objects found on our grounds and from nearby farms are displayed on the table. Of interest is a bird's nest with plastic netting woven into its construction (not a great idea, but the

> birds use the materials they can find). In addition, there are some remarkably interesting rocks on the table. Some are from the nearby Sunshine's farm. The rocks show the presence of lava and steam-created air pockets that confirm the millions-of-years-ago volcanic activity in this area. Two other rocks found about 20

miles from UUC contain aquatic fossils from the time when much of this area was under a shallow sea.

We welcome your additions of other locally found natural materials that help inform us of our geologic history and the ingenuity and adaptability of wildlife and nature. Bring it on and add them to the table!!

Sally and Doug Pfeiffer are our official "Monitors of Bird Watching". They periodically inspect the bird houses on our grounds looking for the species using the boxes, number of eggs in the boxes, fledglings, and box condition. When inspecting on June 13, Doug noted 2 boxes being used by bluebirds, 3 by tree swallows, and 7 by house wrens. While doing the inspection, Doug saw 14 different species of birds on the grounds! Now that is diversity in a small space!

Ground ministry wish list:

- 1) "Master of the Playground". Duties: keeping the playground's mulched areas weeded, periodically trimming the honeysuckle vines growing on the playground fence, and inspecting playaround equipment and toys for safety. Anticipated time commitment is 45 minutes once every 2 weeks.
- 2) Small-engine repair/maintenance person to adjust a gas powered, like new, Stihl leaf blower so that it easily starts.

One of the previous wish lists requests was for an individual to monitor and maintain the Meditation Path, benches, and signage. Yippee! Amanda Haynes is now the official "Path Keeper".

Our grounds workers are a valued group of individuals who invest their time and passion for UUC's grounds. We want to embrace your volunteerism – JOIN THE GROUNDS MINISTRY NOW! We have small, but critical jobs for volunteers. Contact Denise Martin or Susan Baker.
