

Message from Our Minister

Rev. Pam Philips

During the month of June, we'll be considering what it means to be a people of **beauty**. As someone who considers herself artistically challenged, I usually think of appreciating beauty rather than creating it. I've always enjoyed visiting art museums and botanical gardens and attending concerts and dance performances. I had no idea when we moved to Blacksburg that we would have so many opportunities to experience so many and such varied forms of art. Between the galleries and performances at the Moss Arts Center, the weekly summer concerts on Henderson Lawn, the Hahn Botanical Garden, and our own grounds and art shows at UUC--to say nothing of the natural beauty of the New River Valley--I feel blessed to be surrounded by opportunities to witness beauty on a daily basis.



I think of the rituals that mark commitment, dedication, and transition: twenty people participated in new member ceremonies, seven children and their parents participated in the child dedication, and three seniors bridged out of YRUU and into young adulthood.

I think of our weekly Sunday services and the joy of creating them with worship associates who continue to grow in their skills and knowledge and who challenge me to grow, as well. I'm especially inspired by our commitment to create multigenerational worship that feeds all souls.

I think of the times when we've cared for one another—in my own pastoral visits with people, but also the Lay Pastoral Care Ministry associates who make visits or even just wait patiently in the cuddle room after services, the Caring Network members who answer calls for food and other assistance, and less formal networks of caring that form when the need arises.

I think of the times I've left staff and committee meetings (too many to name) and marveled at the time and energy so many people offer this congregation to make sure that we can live into our mission to inspire, create, and transform.

I think of the Stewardship Committee experimenting with new ways of helping the members and friends of UUC to pledge their financial support and the resulting amazing generosity which yielded a record number of pledges (162) and a record amount pledged (\$322,516). And then witnessing the Board's care and commitment to propose a budget that reflects our values.

And these are only a *few* of the times when my spirit was exalted, when I experienced beauty, at UUC. As we explore many aspects of beauty in June, I invite you to reflect on what has exalted your mind and your spirit. When have you witnessed or experienced an instance of beauty, not with your eyes or your ears, but with your heart, mind, and spirit?

Please use this <u>link</u> to sign up for a shift. A prompt response helps us to do the necessary planning and to avoid a last-minute panic.




Second-Sunday Potluck


Summer RE Begins Sunday, June 9 at 10 AM-Grades K-5

May Board Mtg. Highlights

- ◆ The Board met on May 9 & 16 to finalize the proposed budget for the Annual Meeting. Surplus from this year's budget will be rolled over to cover items in the proposed budget.
- Our Stewardship Campaign resulted in a record number of pledges (162) and participation. To date, \$322,516 has been pledged!
- ◆ The Board will work with the Finance Committee on a plan to improve the use of Amazon, Kroger, and building rentals as sources of income.
- ◆ UUC pledged to be a Fair Share congregation with our annual pledge to the UUA for 2019-20.
