## **UUC Social Justice Team Annual Report – May 2023**

**Purpose of the team:** The purpose of the Social Justice Team is to facilitate coordination of the various social justice groups/activities within the congregation and with other social justice groups/activities in the wider community, state and/or national level. The team is to serve as a spark/incubator for the formation of new social justice groups within our congregation based on interests expressed by congregants.

Achievements: The team participated in the formulation of a social justice interest survey for our congregation which was completed in November 2022. From this effort 4 social justice teams emerged that had respondent(s) willing to serve as team leaders: environmental justice/climate change, racial justice, reproductive justice and voting rights. The racial justice team was incorporated into the existing anti-racism group. The other 3 teams held their first meetings in January 2023 and have remained active. The team leader remains our UUC liaison with Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy. Some of the team members are also members of other social justice groups in the area such as Justice Advocates, MRF NAACP and Montgomery County League of Women Voters.

How does the team work to further our mission and vision: The work of this team is an effort to live our 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> UU principles.
