Paying Your Pledge

We continue to get questions about pledge payments like:

How do I pay my pledge?

Is my automatic payment updated to match my new pledge?

- so I've been asked to write a short article about pledge payment.

Your pledge can be paid weekly, monthly, yearly or whatever works for you. The easiest way to pay in installments is to set up an automatic payment using your bank's bill-pay feature. Usually, you will find a link in these online features to pay a company, or, pay a person, enter a payee manually or something similar. The UUC is <u>not</u> going to appear under the company link so you will need to use that alternate option, whatever it is called at your bank. It will ask for a name and an address of the payee. Use:

You can also use personal checks (which can be mailed to the above address or placed in the offering basket), cash or pay online, but online payments (VANCO) cost us a processing fee.

If you currently have a VANCO account and have automatic payments set up through VANCO, you will need to manage that payment yourself. For example, if you changed your pledge amount or have decided to switch to paying through your bank's bill-pay feature (which I recommend to save us the VANCO fees), you will need to make changes in VANCO. The best way to do this is to log into the VANCO app, click on the menu icon in the upper left corner and choose "My Account".

If you don't know your account information, our Administrator can help you cancel your VANCO payments.

No matter how you pay, please **notate each payment** to indicate it is a pledge payment and for which fiscal year, e.g., "24-25 Pledge". This helps our Administrator greatly.

NEWS FROM VOTING RIGHTS TEAM

100% Voting Congregation - Our UUC has pledged, via Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy, to become a 100% voting congregation! Let's all do our part to make that a reality!

You can go to the citizen portal on the Virginia Dept. of Elections website (<u>https://</u><u>vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation</u>) to register to vote, find your polling place, apply to vote absentee by mail or check your registration status. The latter is especially important if your address has changed since the last time you voted.

Below are a few important 2024 dates to remember:

September 20 – Early voting begins

October 15 – Deadline to register to vote or update an existing registration. (Voters may register after this date, through Election Day, and vote using a provisional ballot).

October 25 - Deadline to apply for a ballot to be mailed to you

November 5 - Election Day

Disinformation in the Digital Age

"Disinformation in the Digital Age," a free non-partisan public information program, will be held on Thursday, Sept. 5, from 7:30-8:30 PM at the Lyric Theatre, 135 College Ave. in Blacksburg. The program's focus will include social media, generative AI, fact-checking, finding reliable sources and how all of this may impact elections. The program will conclude with a Q&A, and with tips for responding to disinformation.



Aaraj Vij and Jeremy Swack, the program speakers, hold seven years of experience in research and development in the mis/disinformation sector. As Co-Directors of W&M DisinfoLab, Aaraj and Jeremy led the design and execution of multidisciplinary research on our information environment, including the impacts of social media and generative AI. They have spoken at events hosted by NATO Headquarters, the Global Research Institute, and the Data & Democracy National Security Conference. After years of researching mis/disinformation, Aaraj and Jeremy founded VerbaAI LLC to develop tools to strengthen our information environment.
