Community Service Team - Annual Report 2021-2022

Team Co-chairs: Alison Armstrong and Pauletta Copenheaver; **Team Members:** the membership is somewhat fluid, usually numbering 8-10 attending the meetings, with a list serv of approximately 20 people.

Purpose of the Team: Support a variety of local social action activities in which congregational members, with a broad range of available time, skill levels, and age differences can find ways to become involved.

Achievements:

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, Team members were not able to continue many of the regular activities. Those indicated with a * ceased the activities since March 2020

- Participation in Blacksburg Interfaith Food Pantry a few UUC members alternate assisting one day per week bagging food for client food pick up: resumed monthly UUC volunteers -coordinated by Crosby Houston. Monthly delivery of approximately \$30 worth of food donated by congregants.

- Collecting writing implements to be recycled.
- *Support of RE programs social action projects Blacksburg Interfaith Food Pantry; MC Christmas Store; Humane Society of MC.
- *Continuation of UUC members/friends leading monthly bingo games for the residents of Fairview Home in Dublin, VA.- coordinated by Pauletta Copenheaver
- Continued monthly donation and delivery of treats for the children sheltered by the Women's Resource Center; assisted with UUC adoption of two families in WRC Adopt-A-Family holiday presents coordinated by Mary Virginia Woods.

Lessons Learned: As the pandemic shifts to an epidemic, CST is gradually resuming most of its activities.
